



Their is no other subject identified in the Hampton incident information of another possible victim initially came from he wavered on this and eventually stated that he did not have first hand information about another subject. Father Macrae never came to the attention of the Diocese as in need of treatment for alcoholism. They learned afterwards that he had entered counseling on his own with a church paid therapist for this treatment. This became known to them when they confronted Macrae about the Hampton incident.

When questioned about Hampton, Macrae admitted to having sit on his lap and kissing him. He said was having problems and he was counseling him at the time and this incident happened as a result of his trying to console the boy. A memo was written about this contact with Macrae. He was not questioned about any other sexual activity as the church was unaware of anything further at the

The Church through its lawyer (Dunn) described four items that ney felt that they could not release.

- 1. A personal letter to Father Macrae from a Father Joseph Gary. Assurances were made that their was nothing in this letter that was material to this investigation.
- 2. A 1986 letter to Marilyn Frazier of DCYS from the church therapist recapping treatment given to Father Macrae. Again nothing pertinent was in this letter that would be of interest to us according to church officials.
- 3. A letter from the therapist Henry ----Willette to Father Quinn regarding the 1986 re-investigation.
- 4. A Dec. 7th, 1988 letter to Pather Christian from a Dr. Russell Saveyor (sp) regarding treatment testing administered to Father Macrae while at the Strafford Guidance Center.

Father Christina told us about an inquiry from DCYS regarding Father Macrae having some type of legal custody of a boy from the Groveton area (believed to be been made, they were acting out concern for appearance at the time.

DCYS made this move and what information they were acting on unknown.

Macrae applied for a leave of absence in 1987 which was granted. He went to work with the Substance Abuse center in Swanzey. While in this capacity, a minister from Spofford Hall contacted the diocese and asked that Macrae be given the rights to serve mass at the Hall and this was granted. This was a "limited ministry" and dealt only with his serving mass once a week at the Hall. No complaint about Macrae was received by the church but they later became aware and knew the State Police investigated and that nothing further occurred at nothing was ever heard from them.

Christian said he received 2 or 3 calls from about sexual solicitations made by Father Macrae. These calls came a few months prior to Macrae being arrested (1988). It told Christian that Macrae was under investigation by the Keene Police. Her concern upset with his victimization. Christian called Macrae and questioned him regarding the information that he had solicited for sex. Macrae once accused another falsely. This was a man who Christian felt was from Troy or Fitzwilliam and worked at some center. It was Fairgrounds and was later convicted on child sex charges. Although Christian did not have a subsequent conversation with Macrae regarding this inconsistency.

No complaints were ever received from any other priest regarding suspicions about Macrae.

Their was a murder of a priest (Fr. Joseph Sands) in Littleton, NH years ago in which a priest was taken hostage and killed, the hostage takens killed themselves. Father Scruton was the parish priest and was out for the day. Another priest was covering for him and answered the call that resulted in his murder.

Father Macrae is still Father Macrae. He has not been formally removed from the church. He can state to others that he is a catholic priest, a title he will have for life unless he elects to cut his affiliation with the church. He can't serve mass or perform other church business, nor is it likely he will ever be hired to be a priest anywhere in the Country.

I spoke with Judy Paterson, and she confirmed hat was the source for the reference to two victims in Hampton. Telt that his victimization by Macrae indicated the possibility of another victim. No actual subject was known, was speculating as a result of his experiences with Macrae.

Paterson knew Macrae but when she became involved with counseling Macrae was already reassigned to Keene. She feels that their was a number of indicators about Macrae that should have resulted in identifying Macrae as a threat to children, but added that at the time information about child sexual abuse was just becoming known. No conversations occurred between Paterson and Macrae regarding his crimes.

Paterson commented that their was quit the cover up after came forward.

also spoke about her son When he was first adopted he was about six years old. It was then discovered that he was sexually (Orall) assaulted by a 15 year old boy. He also was friendly and still is with Gordon. Walso spend a few nights with Gordon in the rectory. It is presently in the NH state Prison serving time (1 to 3) for violation of probation.

In April of 1987 started to work at the DCYS office on a part time basis. Before she took the job she found Gordon trying to talk her out of taking the position. She feels now that Gordon might have been attempting to stop her in fear of her being privy to his past incident in Hampton.

Just prior to the July Spofford Hall incident. had had no real contact with the suspect. However in July after the disclosure he called hach night. never asked her a direct question about what she knew. But feels that he ted to milk her for information and she was on to him.

feels very betrayed about Gordon relationship with her family. She feels if she didn,t have sons then wouldn,t have even bothered. She recalled an incident a few years ago in which she received a large color TV which was seat from Montgomery Wards. then found out that Gordon was the one who sent it.

states that Gordon travels to Kanchester every wensday for therapy. She then recalled an incident in which her son was in a rough neighborhood in Manchester probably looking for a drug deal. While there he told his mother he found Gordon's car and didn,t know why he would be in that area. He left a note on Gordon's car, whether Gordon said anything back to or not isn,t known. It is presently in California.

I asked to make notes on any points that she remembers. I explained to hat others I spoke with about Gordon, had recalled facts about him that flooded back after some thought. She stated she would do so. She also agreed to speak with her son about speaking with me about this case.

denied any sexual involvement with Gordon, nor any solicitation. He even started to tell me about how he dislikes homosexuals and that where he is at, their are many to deal with. He then went into his appreciation of the female body and offered proof of his masculinity by saying he was a father and had a little girl. The interview for the most part was unproductive.

On 4 Nov 83, I exi with Sylvia Gale and we discussed this case. Sgt Brown also attended and we discussed options in the case and other avenues that needed to be covered. She also suggested that I contact Carelyn DeBell about other information on the suspect.

On 4 Nov 88, I called DeBell and she stated she worked the Berlin area between 1976-83. While there she had met MacRae once. Another social worker was out sick and she took his place in the Groveton Court. MacRae was given custody of a _______ The hearing centered around the suspect being unable to take care of the child any longer. He was then taken out of MacRae's care and placed in the Dover Child care facility. Just prior to this incident a Jenet Gunion had called Debell back then and had made an inquary into MacRae. BeBell believes she was conducting an investigation at the time. Gunion presently works for the Adult and Elderly services.
